

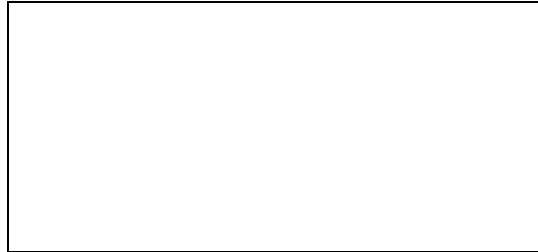

## From The Pastor....



JULY/AUGUST 2012

Remember the parable of the mustard seed? Although most of us know and love the message that just a tiny bit of faith is enough to move mountains, we usually overlook the fact that the mustard Jesus was talking about was a prolific weed! Jesus essentially said, "The Kingdom of God is like **crabgrass!**"

Wait! Most of us work hard to kill crabgrass! We want to rid our lawn of undesirable stuff. Is Jesus saying that the Kingdom of God is **undesirable?**

The Jewish leaders, who took their responsibility to protect the Jewish faith and traditions seriously, saw Jesus as so undesirable that they found a way to get rid of him! (Or, at least they **thought** they did!) Sometimes, Jesus and the Holy Spirit push us into **new** ways of thinking about the Kingdom and the church that we may not like. Maybe that's why Jesus compared the Kingdom to crabgrass.

But I think an important part of the parable is the weed's ability to spread and thrive. Think about it! When the summer heat destroys your lawn, what is left? Often, the crabgrass keeps growing and spreading even when the better aspects of the lawn die away.

We like to think that we are in charge of the church, that we are the protectors of tradition. (Oh - that's just what the Jewish leaders who opposed Jesus were doing, isn't it?) Despite our laments over declining

church attendance and the waning influence of the church, God's church **will** continue to grow and **will** continue to make a difference in our world, even when we hold it back. Jesus invites us to help him change the world. But we need to keep our eyes and ears open, and stay alert to be sure that we haven't taken a wrong turn somewhere!

God keeps raising up people to serve him faithfully. Open your eyes and see what God is doing! (Careful! Are you sure that is a weed, or is it God at work?) I see God acting at Faith. I see a children's Sunday School that struggles. Where are the children? Should we give up? Certainly not! Who knows where their faith will lead them, all because there **was** a Sunday School class for them every time they came, whether they stayed or not!

I see a Relay for Life team. The group looks relatively small, but Shirley Weimer reported that they had raised over \$15,000 this past year!

Bible School struggled to find students - but a whole crew of adults turned out to make Bible School possible!

**Worship:** Pentecost is May 27<sup>th</sup>; we will be using the chancel drama "The Church is Burning."

**Education:** Vacation Bible School has been set for the week of June 25<sup>th</sup> through 29<sup>th</sup>. Time will be 6:00 pm to 8:15 pm. The closing program will be July 1 during the worship service. The theme is "Promise Island" focusing on the promises of God.

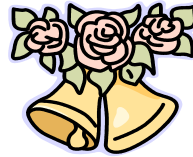
