Looking out the window from my church office, I have a daily view of the landscape across the way as bulldozers lift, push, and move multi-colored layers of earth back and forth along the contours of the hillside; a form of artistry as they endeavor to re-sculpt what once was. The changing landscape reminds me of the hikes Allen and I enjoyed around the manmade lake named "Lake Marburg" at Codorus State Park when we moved to south central Pennsylvania. Over a span of 35+ years we walked up and down small hills (hills which our bodies now tell us are not so small), swatting gnats away from our faces, steering clear of anything that resembled poison ivy or poison oak, maneuvering mud puddles from a heavy rain, and following the windy paths that wound round the edge of these manmade lakes. As the years passed, we noted the differences in the landscape as they changed from year to year and even from one hike to another. It was the same path, the lake waters still lapped up against its edges, and fish could still be spotted here and there under its surface, but there was always something different to see and experibe spotted here and there under its surface, but there was always something different to see and experience: A tree had fallen...someone had built a new "bridge" of rocks to span water in a low-lying area...the water was lower or higher...the geese had changed which side of the lake to "call home"...or the line of the lake had changed...but it was and still is Lake Marburg at Codorus State Park.

In every generation of every century, the theology of the Christian church has changed, just like the landscape across the road from the church and around Lake Marburg. The 21st century is no different as

we find ourselves in the midst of an ever-changing cultural landscape.

So, what is different? How did we get here? Going back to the Pre-Modern Period (700-1500) the church was the leading authority – scientists had no firm standing with their discoveries if the church did not find them in accordance with church line pretations. God was in control of everything and everything had an explanation in accordance with Holy Scripture - literally. For example, Galileo was found guilty of heresy because he advocated that the sun was at the center of the universe; he spent the majority of his life under house arrest and the church forced him to recant his stance.

Next came the Modern Period - the Period of Enlightenment and the Romantic Movement (1650-1950). This was when the shift in power moved away from the church and scholars became the primary sources of authority. The church no longer wielded its privilege; human reasoning was at the forefront. Religion

was viewed as "social" and humans in charge and in control of their progress, not God.

That brings us to today, the period of Postmodernism. Postmodern theology no longer relies on one of the previous approaches but a mixture of "social" (relational), scientific (Yes! faith and science go together!!!) and spiritual interpretations. It recognizes that life, all of life, is interconnected. The world and its history are viewed holistically, recognizing the diversity of its people, other cultures and other religions. Through the generations and centuries, the landscape of our Christian theology has changed, it has abbed and flowed and its centuries to change within the centure of each area. We centique to the second state of each area.

ebbed and flowed, and it continues to change within the context of each era. We continue to ask questions as we seek to learn and understand, nurture, wonder, believe, trust and hope. The "face" of our Christian theology continues to change but when God looks at us, sees us, God still sees us as God's beloved children.



# **Grow † Serve Chicken BBQ**



## **Liturgy – The Work of the People**

The word "liturgy" is taken from Greek; its root translation is "people work" or, "work of the people". When I was younger, I thought "liturgy" referred to "the service" itself; that "liturgy" was a prescribed format of worship that one does not dare go against and had nothing to do with the people assembled, that we were merely spectators. I thought the word "liturgy" as a term, not as an "action" or interaction. Over the years, however, in witnessing and learning, and becoming active in sharing my gifts and lifting up the gifts of others in worship, I have found that my earlier perspective diminished the true meaning of "liturgy".

Liturgy is action, it is what we do! It is everything we do. It is what we are able to do. Liturgy is using our talents, our knowledge, our abilities and our experience – our gifts from God – in worship. Liturgy is not the sole actions of one, the presider but that of the congregation, the parishioners. The presider assists and facilitates; it is the people of the church who are its ministers, its liturgists - people of all ages, gender, experience and education. People serving as ushers, communion assistants, instrumentalists, teachers, storytellers, greeters, lectors, acolytes and singers are all leaders of worship – all are leaders of the church.

Liturgy is sharing.

Liturgy is community-building.

Liturgy extends friendship and fellowship.

Liturgy lifts the gifts of others so that they may lead.

Liturgy is the heart of Christian worship as we lift our voices in prayer and song, as we gather and welcome people at the door, within and beyond our brick building, and as we give praise and thanks to God.

As summer begins to fade, I invite you to prayerfully discern sharing your gifts as a minister of this church. YOUR gifts are needed!

Openings include: Children's Sunday School assistants, Worship Planning Committee, Eucharistic Visitors, Offering counters, Social Ministry and Choir – all "God's work, our hands"! Additional "hands" are also welcome as Greeters & Ushers, Acolytes, readers (lectors), Altar Guild members, and Assisting Ministers – there is something for everyone!
