January 2018

Merry Christmas and Happy New Year to all of you. I pray that you were able to have a wonderful time with family and or friends this year. I thought it would be appropriate to have a brief word about the Church seasons; as we have three seasons in quick succession approaching. Most of us have celebrated the seasons many times throughout our lives but understanding a little bit more about them can allude us.

First, we just completed the Advent Season in the life of the church which is a yearly season that prepares us for celebrating the Nativity of the Lord. This season is traditionally celebrated with the color blue or sometimes purple in different parts of the country. During this season we take time to consider the promises of God to the people throughout the ages as well as to us now. We focus on how God has always kept the promises that have been made to people and hope for the day when Jesus's promise to return is fulfilled.


Second is the Liturgical Season of Christmas which begins on the Nativity of the Lord and goes for twelve days. This season is marked by the decorations of brightly colored lights and evergreen wreaths and trees to celebrate the Life in God that we share. In other places of the world they do not decorate during Advent but wait until Christmas to decorate. This time is also when the exchange of gifts happen with Christians remembering Gods great gift to us in the form of Jesus. The color of Christmas season is white with some churches in different parts of the country using gold instead.

The third Liturgical Season is Epiphany, which begins after the twelfth day of Christmas. The season begins with the reading of the magi or wisemen coming to visit Jesus and the Holy Family. As such, it has become custom to wait to include the wisemen in nativity scenes until the first day of Epiphany. The Second Sunday of Epiphany concludes epiphentide, normally around the 18<sup>th</sup> of January and is recognized in parts of Europe as the last day to remove Christmas decorations from homes. This has not become popular in the United States, as most people place Christmas decorations up at the beginning of Advent and remove them at the end of Christmas. The Season of Epiphany goes all the way to Shrove or Fat Tuesday. This time includes the reading of the bible which reveals Christ to the world, including the Baptism of the Lord, the preaching of John the Baptist, Child Jesus teaching in the temple.

The seasons of the church were more popular in Europe during the beginning of the Reformation as they helped structure the culture of the people in the area. As the churches moved to the new world, the different protest movements began to distance themselves from church seasons as a way to further reject the Catholic Church. This is why most non-denominational congregations have no church seasons. I hope this brief word on the seasons helps us to appreciate the seasons we celebrate a little more.

## The Recipe Corner ...

Here is a recipe for chicken wings that can be served at your Super Bowl Party.

1 C ketchup 1/2 C brown sugar 1 Tbsp apple cider vinegar 1 Tbsp sriracha sauce 1 tsp light soy sauce 1/2 tsp cumin

3# chicken wings

Combine all ingredients and stir well. Pour over wings and let marinate overnight.

Cover a baking sheet with foil, put wings on sheet and bake at 450° for 30-35 minutes.

This recipe can also be used for ribs but you may need to adjust the baking time.
