How does your garden grow?

That was the thought that ran through my mind as I planted my garden at the parsonage. Allen had added several bags of "new" garden soil, amended the upper beds with fertilizer and hand-tilled it altogether. We had purchased a few tomato plants, a dozen or so pepper plants, bean and cucumber seeds, and one set of onions. Always wanting to try something new, this year I planted my onions using a bulb planter; it made the perfect-sized hole at just the depth I had wanted. As I did so, I remembered my dad's summer jaunts to the garden just before supper, plucking green onions from the long line of neat rows, washing them, trimming them and setting them at his place at the table in a small, clear glass of cold water. He made quite an event of it! Pouring salt directly on the table (which, when we were younger, seemed amazing in of itself!) and selecting one of the slender green fronds with a small white stem then dipping it into the salt pile in between each bite! Of course, he invited my brothers and sister and I to do so too but, at first, we did so timidly because, well, you know, as well as I, that when you bite into a raw onion, it isn't quite like eating a piece of chocolate! We all came to enjoy the satisfying, salty crunch that came with eating the "fruits" that came from our own backyard.

I have always included a set of onions, or two, or three, in my gardening repertoire of veggies. I enjoy seeing the yellow, white and red bulbs as they emerge from the soil. I check on them regularly, doing a number of things to contribute to their success: I weed the space around them; I have a fence around them; and I water them when nature doesn't. I do not, however, remove the dirt from the roots to check their ability to grow because some things are just out of my control; all I can do is wait and let the growing that God put in place work.

Imagine what would happen if I uncovered the onion bulbs every day to see if they had roots, or to measure the amount of growth from the root to the green tip. Imagine what would happen if I pulled an onion from the ground every day to see how big the bulb was getting. How many times could I put it back in the ground before it would wither and die? Some things are best tended by leaving them alone and trusting them to do what they were designed to do by God.

There are three attributes to gardening: trust, patience, and faith. The gardener must trust that mature plants will grow from the seeds and bulbs she planted. Then, there must be patience - letting thingshappen as it may, waiting and watching without interrupting. Finally, there must be faith, the willingness to depend on a good outcome based on the unseen: I may not see my cucumber seeds germinating, I may not see my pepper plants flowering, but I believe all this will happen.

We are very much like the onions sets newly planted in the garden. We don't see all the potential God has packed into each one of us....but it is in there! When we contribute when we should, wait patiently when we must, and trust confidently while we wait knowing that God's good intent will bear good fruit...and God knows just how to shake off the dirt.
