Putting scripture into context....

I invite you to read Paul's letter and then read the letter according to my personal perspective... can you "see" God's word come to life as a reflection of something experienced in today's context?

This is a form of telling God's story referred to as narrative preaching. See if you can align each step of Paul's journey with the one I experience. For example, what is my "thorn" in this "telling" and sharing? Perhaps you have a journey that reflects this same scripture. How would you share this text from your life's experience, in your own words? I would be interested to hear your stories!



From the Second Epistle from Paul to the Corinthians, Paul writes:

"It is necessary to boast; nothing is to be gained by it, but I will go on to visions and revelations of the Lord. I know a person in Christ who fourteen years ago was caught up to the third heaven -- whether in the body or out of the body I do not know; God knows. And I know that such a person -- whether in the body or out of the body I do not know; God knows -- was caught up into Paradise and heard things that are not to be told, that no mortal is permitted to repeat. On behalf of such a one I will boast, but on my own behalf I will not boast, except of my weaknesses. But if I wish to boast, I will not be a fool, for I will be speaking the truth. But I refrain from it, so that no one may think better of me than what is seen in me or heard from me, even considering the exceptional character of the revelations. Therefore, to keep me from being too elated, a thorn was given me in the flesh, a messenger of Satan to torment me, to keep me from being too elated. Three times I appealed to the Lord about this, that it would leave me, but he said to me, "My grace is sufficient for you, for power is made perfect in weakness." So, I will boast all the more gladly of my weaknesses, so that the power of Christ may dwell in me. Therefore I am content with weaknesses, insults, hardships, persecutions, and calamities for the sake of Christ; for whenever I am weak, then I am strong."

A Hike in the Woods - 2 Corinthians 12:1-10 – From My Life’s Experience

in loving memory of my father, Jim Davis....

When I was growing up, my family would go camping at a state park called Prince Gallitzin located in the forested hills along the Allegheny Plateau in Cambria County; about a two-hour drive from our home in Latrobe. Prince Gallitzin was our annual summer destination. For one week ... every year, we would canoe, fish, and swim in the cool, tranquil waters of its man-made lake and crane our necks as we looked with wide-eyed wonder at the night sky, endlessly deep in every direction, lit only by the moon and the twinkling stars that pierced its vast inky darkness.

As a family, we would hike the windy trails that interlaced the forest of towering pine, maple, and oak trees. My mother would spray us down mercilessly with bug repellent, the citronella aroma a warning to any and all mosquitos within a 50-mile range while my father unpacked what he called the “real necessity” of hiking –an old army canteen, its green fabric tattered by time. “It’s all we need” he would say, filling it with water until it bubbled out over the top and screwing on the old metal cap so tight that Hercules himself would have had to strain his muscles to open it.

Not one to boast, I believe my dad had a way of making each hike an adventure in learning about God’s creation. He taught us about the trees, the insects, the creatures that called the woods home and, yes, survival tactics. An MP and paratrooper in the army stationed at the Berlin Wall in Germany, Dad was an encyclopedia of knowledge. He was eager to share and instill what he had gleaned while serving, and his repertoire of stories, well, the ones he could repeat for young ears to hear, seemed endless.

On one such occasion, we set out in the early morning when the white mist of the fog still kissed the lake and the crisp morning air mingled with the smoke from the previous night’s campfire. Dad had picked out a trail the night before; I had hiked a longer trail one other year, a trail that led to a mountaintop view of this forested paradise. We won’t have time for that trail today, he said, but this one will be good practice.

We stepped on to the windy trail with an enthusiastic stride. My dad led the way, the army canteen swaying back and forth like a pendulum from his broad shoulders. The air smacked of moss and pine and a woodpecker in the distance tapped out a Morse code warning that humans had entered the wooded domain. The sound of our footsteps was all that punctuated our thoughts as we breathed in the heady scents and feasted on the panoramic scene set before our eyes.

As one might expect, a hike in the woods with a child or a teenager, let alone four of them, is bound to experience a few hitches along the way – mud puddles to span, pebbles in shoes that felt like boulders, and dagger-like briars that stuck to clothing, hair, and skin. My dad listened to our list of complaints while exuding patience and words of encouragement.

I can still hear his voice echoing back to the ranks, sometimes singing the words to the Ballad of the Green Beret, his favorite tune, and saying “it will put hair on your chest”, “it’s mind over matter”, and “where there’s a will there’s a way!” Well, I wasn’t sure I wanted to have hair on my chest, I didn’t know what my mind had to do with anything when it was all about the rock in my shoe, and I wondered how “a will” would be of any use in the middle of the woods – wasn’t that something you needed before you died? Although these words of encouragement were confusing, they did the trick, and the troops marched on.

We stopped three times along the way, admiring the sights and smells that studded the journey. Dad handed the canteen to my twin brother who took this task very seriously, he had plans to join the Air Force after high school...He gave us each a “swig” of its cool, thirst-quenching treasure, saying “just enough to wet your whistle, that’s all you need”.

This also gave me a chance to try to empty the contents of my sneaker from the pebble that reminded me it was there with each and every step. By the third stop, the pebble had become a mechanism of torture and a master of hide and seek. Try as I might, no matter how hard I shook my shoe, the pebble of pain remained.

“Let’s keep moving Kathy”... “it will make you stronger”. Yet another one of my dad’s motivational remedies...I could not fathom how pain in any way, shape or form would make me stronger – wouldn’t it do the opposite? “You can do it”, he said, as he stretched out his hand, helping me to my feet. “Here, take a sip”. He offered me the canteen and I savored the wet relief as it trickled down my throat.

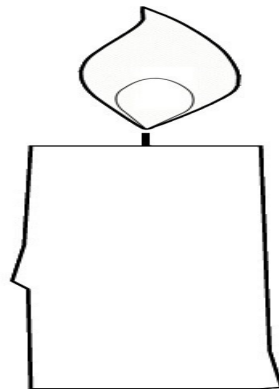
Even though the pebble persisted to assault the tender underside of my foot, buoyed by my father’s strength and the gift poured out from the canteen, I gained a sense of determination and kept on walking.

My dad was strong and I was very proud of him. Occasionally we would lose our way that day but he would always get us back on track. I trusted my dad to get us home.

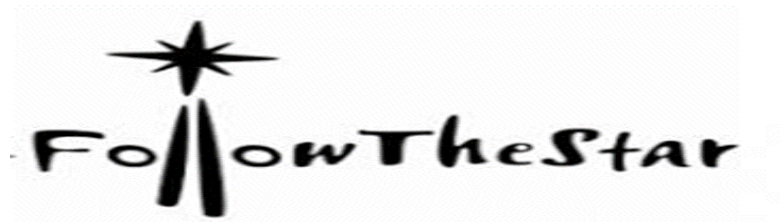

Have you ever wondered why the wise men, the magi, were searching the stars for signs of a coming king?

Who were they looking for?

Make a commitment this Christmas season to not miss out on the fun, but to make the daily holiday fun about something that truly matters.

Each Sunday during Advent, children of all ages will receive a star to decorate. For a fun advent activity in your home, centered on adoring the One who came, hide the stars in a different place around your house each day, starting December 1st – the first day of Advent (which just happens to fall on a Sunday!

Encourage your children, your grandchildren and even your significant others to find the hidden star/s (or you might designate days for each person to take a turn hiding the star/s). Once the star/s are discovered, use this time to talk about who we are waiting for—Jesus.

Faith Council Minutes September 12, 2019

Council met September 12th, 2019, with five (5) members and Pastor Kathy present. Dave Miller had opening devotions.

Minutes from Council's last meeting held August 8, 2019, together with the Treasurer's Report and a breakdown of the monthly service contract fees were reviewed. Motions were made, seconded and approved for each report. Pastor Kathy provided her report and expressed thanks to all for their prayers and support as she, Allen and their family mourn the unexpected death of Allen's mom, Peg, whom many of Faith's church family met at the parsonage open house.

Committee Reports:

Finance Tally sheet reviewed.

Social Community Dinners were well received this summer; at last dinner held the community gave thanks to all the hands that prepared the food and made them welcome – attendees stayed well beyond the normal time, even spending time talking in the parking lot! Preparations being made for Pastor Kathy's Installation dinner, Music Night – an evening to get together for fun and fellowship – music, dessert, and activities for children of all ages; Blessing of the Animals; and Meals on Wheels desserts. Prepared funeral meal for family and friends of Jim Fieg.

Worship Choir practice back in swing with the addition of several new members. New additional Assisting Minister to be added to schedule. Children and youth invited to assist with installation service. Preparing for monthly anointing for healing during worship on the last Sunday of each month.

Education Many new initiatives to engage adult education and faith formation coming up to include prayer stations in back of Sanctuary; "Scrunch Time" which is intentional time spent with scripture and prayer over a light lunch or supper; and Sabbath – A Woman's Book Club. Rally Day -10 children/youth participated overall with families reporting how much they enjoyed it.

Youth Preparing for "Youth in Action's" first gathering in September, "Taco 'Bout Awesome"; there is a lot of excitement being expressed. The service project from this gathering will be used as part of the Thanksgiving Eve service. October's theme set – "Going Bananas" – all are welcome to join as the group makes the largest banana split ever seen at Faith! Confirmed youth and eligible for confirmation were invited to a Lock-In Event, on Oct. 4-5. Pastor Kathy working with four area Lutheran pastors in organizing event. Youth will gather at Farranda Farms for Corn Maze, campfire and mountain pies followed by a scavenger hunt at Christ Casebeer. Pastor Kathy will be teaching one of the Saturday morning lessons

Property Lines painted in parking lot (thank you!). Dave and Carl will look at the stove hood at parsonage following meeting. Discussed doorbell at front entrance not working; remove. Discussed the sliding door still not being sold and offering to congregation and community for free-will donation. Discernment invited regarding hospitality as it relates to wheelchair accessibility – consider making a space or other options – noting funeral accessibility to front pews for immediate family members and the challenges that can present themselves. Rick will be cleaning, waxing and buffing floors.

Mission Team is making plans for trip to Guatemala.

Chicken BBQ's for Grace Delivered mobile ministry continue; getting close to the congregational goal of \$1000. Last BBQ set for September 22nd.

New Business:

Employee Review Committee to meet.

Budget Meeting needs to be scheduled.

Reports are needed from committees in preparation for annual congregational meeting.
