Rummaging through boxes of books and notes these past few weeks in the process of trying to downsize a bit, I came across a favorite read by Darrell L. Guder entitled Missional Church: A Vision for the Sending of the Church in North America. As I thumbed through the pages, I took note of some of the points and comments I had underlined, double-underlined and highlighted within the margins. One such note was Guder's definition of the word "mission", in which he stated meant "Sending" and that it is "the central biblical theme describing the purpose of God's action in human history." A missional church is also contextual in nature. As the world changes, so must the church; it must be flexible, adapting to an ever-changing culture, demographics, and economics.



The words that came to mind as I re-read this statement are those imparted at the end of each weekly service as we are sent out, in peace, to serve God, and we respond in thanks, affirming that we Our weekly commission, as followers of Christ, is to go out and serve the world as exemplified by Jesus. I cannot help but admire this bold affirmation heard round the sanctuary as we proclaim these words but I also sometimes wonder if some do so automatically, without thought to the depth of meaning that dwells within this affirmation...this "Thanks be to God...we will!" said in unison. In essence, do we realize that we are setting ourselves apart from the secular world, as Jesus did, in serving our neighbors, standing against injustice, and embracing those who live on the fringes of society? Do we realize we are a missional church?

Mission is not something we do "in" church when we attend worship and it is not something we do ourselves; rather, it is what God does through us as we go out, <u>as the church</u>, the body of Christ, into our communities, our workplaces, and our schools. "The Great Commission in the Gospel of Matthew says to 'go out and make disciples' not benchwarmers." Missional church does not exist in a vacuum where one just goes to church, week after week, for an hour or so, and believe that is all there is to being the church. "Being" the church, a missional church, is not about receiving, it is about <u>extending</u>.

YES! Faith Lutheran Church is a missional church and the people of Faith, YOU, are doing just that – loving, growing, serving and going! The many ways in which we serve Christ and community, even, and especially, in the midst of a pandemic, continue to bless many of our friends, neighbors and the world: supporting the ministries of the church with your offerings; collecting food items for community member in need; putting together goodie bags for the residents of a local personal care home; "bee-ing" sweet by donating your change so that Faith could purchase bee colonies through ELCA's Good Gifts Program; making "superhero" candies for caregivers; providing blankets to help keep people warm; baking cakes, cookies, and muffins for Meals-on-Wheels; supporting and assisting with area schools and scout troops and PARC and Relay and council and the cemetery and...the list goes on!

Reflecting theologically, grounded in baptism, we are, each of us, children of God, called and named by God, united with Christ by his death and resurrection. We are members of a community of faith, the body of Christ, set free from sin and given the hope of salvation, through God's abundant love and grace, because of the faith of Jesus Christ, so that we may serve Christ and community IN community, accepting of all, loving all and sharing with all the grace and unconditional love God bestows - through proclamation and faithful witness to the Gospel. May we continue to reflect and remember what it means to be community and how we go about sharing, proclaiming the gospel, and continue to "be" the church as God calls us to be in an ever-changing world.


Our hope is that your family will experience Christmas together in a way that is memorable, meaningful and joyful this holiday season.
