"I am always with you." This is what we believe but do not always "see" in the ordinary. For example, the pattern of stars in a moonlit sky; the layers of rock and stone revealed along Route 30 as one weaves through the cut-outs we call roads through the mountains, the rolling nature of hills and fields, the intricacies of a single leaf. I believe that these are the "masks of God" that invite us to view creation from a different perspective. God, who declared all creation "good" reveals God's love for us in creation.

When we look behind a mask, we do so to reveal what is hidden. This reminds me of my dad and his love for woodcarving. He would take a small piece of wood from the woodpile, carry it around the house for weeks, just turning it over and over in his hand. If you asked him what he was doing with the block of wood he would say he was just waiting for it to tell him what was hidden inside. Sometimes the wood told him it itself to him as a bear, or turtle, or bird; a gift of beauty revealed in something ordinary.

As children, we wore Halloween masks to keep our faces hidden. So the question is why would God hide behind a mask? An ordinary mask? I believe God does so so that we seek God out in the ordinary; that we look beyond ourselves, our masks – to reveal God in the faces of the homeless, the hungry, and the oppressed so that we can love them as God loves them; to reveal God in creation so that we can be good stewards; to reveal God in the provision of our everyday needs so that we can share the abundance with our neighbors.

God has also chosen us to be God's mask in the world. As parents, grandparents, and brothers and sisters in Christ, God uses us to teach our children how to love other people, to love creation, and to be faithful to God. Simply stated, God has chosen us to be part of their growing up in the world. It is God who is raising them and providing for them through us.

Luther refers to this as a "mask" of God also. "God gives every good thing, but not just by waving a wand." God gives all good gifts; but you must lend a hand and take the bull by the horns; that is, you must work and thus give God good cause and a mask." (*Luther's Works*, Vol. 14, pp. 114–15). When we live out our vocations as teachers, mentors, and encouragers, God is doing his work with our hands as we guide them through life – from baptism, through confirmation into adulthood - so that they may become the people God wants them to grow up to be. Paraphrasing Author Gene Veith's explanation of the mask analogy: "On the surface, we see an ordinary human face—our parents, the doctor, the teacher, the waitress, yes, the pastor too —but, beneath the appearances, God is ministering to us through them. God is hidden in human vocations". In all of our vocations in this earthly life, we are used by God as His masks to show His love to others.

Then there is the ultimate mask, Jesus Christ, who through his life, death and resurrection, reveals His love for God, His love for us, and God's desire to be in relationship with us. This is the Good News we proclaim in serving Christ and community in community...in our vocations...and in creation.
