

Ask the Pastor, "Why?"

It is not uncommon for the pastor to be asked Why?"..."Why do people suffer? As I listen and reflect, I "hear" these questions not directed at me, personally, but towards God...and that is okay. It is okay to ask questions. Doing so opens our hearts and minds to God. With that, I am drawn to the thorn that Paul suffered from which he attributed to be a blessing. Paul viewed suffering as a blessing, one to boast about! It was a reminder to him that he was, in fact, human – frail – and the weakness of suffering he deemed sanctifying (to set apart to a sacred purpose). We are human, we rely on God; our suffering invites us to look to God and to know God. In 2 Cor. 4:17, Paul says, "For our light affliction, which is but for a moment, is working in us a far more exceeding and eternal weight of glory." Although the human body, the flesh, is dying, outwardly, it is becoming new, inwardly. For Paul, suffering strengthens faith. "Therefore, I am content with weaknesses,

of Christ; for whenever I am weak, then I am strong." Why do people suffer? This is a question which cannot truly be answered. The depth of human suffering is multi-layered – mentally, physically, economically and socially. Looking to the apostle Paul's life, it mirrored these multilayers of suffering in that he was imprisoned, lashed, flogged, shipwrecked, stoned, and "beaten with




rods". He traveled through dangerous cities, seas and wildernesses. Paul went without food, clothing, water and sleep. He found himself having to defend himself against his brothers and sisters in faith. Paul also experienced the pressure and anxiety that come with the responsibility of apostleship and in his love and concern for the people of God.

For Paul, suffering is part of being human and must be endured. In our love for one another, that can be quite a challenge because we believe, in those moments, that we need to fix everything.

The truth is, however, that we can't do anything without God. Moreover, how do we endure suffering? Paul prayed to God about the pain he endured from "a thorn". God did not answer the way he expected, as God does not always seem to answer the way we expect God to, yet Paul found consolation in God and in others. He used his suffering and consolation to console others and that is what we can do in blessing others in their suffering. (2 Cor 1:3-4; 6-7).

Paul wrote: "Oh, the depth of the riches and wisdom and knowledge of God! How unsearchable are his judgments and how fathomless his ways!" (Romans 11:33). What I believe Paul is saying is that our questions and our understandings are through the lens of human reasoning and not God's. Our human logic cannot be utilized in trying to understand God's actions; we cannot answer the "Why?". Perhaps it is the wrong question because we cannot change anything. We must never allow our questions to choke out our faith. Rather, we should look to Jesus and focus on the Lord. We must look beyond suffering in this life and seek to know "What future does God have for me?" The key is to pray ... to seek God's plan and timing ... Trust in God's plan.

April 1st


Children and Youth Bell Practice for Easter - we will practice this morning at 10 a.m. - come ring with us in celebration of Jesus resurrection on Easter morning.
