

### COME TO THE TABLE

The table set with bread and wine...

A simple setting that tells the most profound story of all time...

The story of Christ's broken body and our fragmented humanity, of God's presence, provision, and promise to heal.



Breaking bread and eating together has been part of Christian worship since Christianity's earliest days. Meals are more than just a handy metaphor in the Bible. God often uses meals to prove God's provision for, redemption of, and ongoing communion with humanity.

"Come to the Table" Service of Word and Table scheduled for Wednesday evenings during Lent, March 1st through the 29th, at 6:30 p.m. will guide us into the meaning of food: in Scripture - from the fall in Genesis to the Last Supper; Christian tradition; history; and our own lives. As we examine the ways food and community are intimately connected, we will see how God uses food to heal our relationships with our bodies, our relationships with community and our relationship with God.

Gathered together in the Fellowship Hall, a light meal of soup, bread and beverage will be shared together with conversation and fellowship. Our hope is that you would "catch a

glimpse of the joy, abundance, and the holy imagination of what it means to feast together," and leave "more hopeful for a church where all are fed."

# AMAZING grace S CELEBRATING 250 YEARS

1773-2023

The beloved Christian hymn "Amazing Grace" was penned by the English poet and Anglican clergyman John Newton to accompany a sermon he preached on New Year's Day, 1773. Over the last 250 years, it has become an immensely popular hymn, particularly in the United States, where it is used for both religious and secular purposes. The text for the hymn is drawn from 1 Chronicles 17:16-17, in which King David responds to the prophet Nathan's words that God intends to continue David's royal line for eternity. The text reads:

Then King David went in and sat before the LORD and said, "Who am I, O LORD God, and what is my house, that you have brought me thus far? And even this was a small thing in your sight, O God; you have also spoken of your servant's house into the distant future. You regard me as someone of high rank, O LORD God!

Newton wrote the words of "Amazing Grace" from his own personal experience. In 1748 while Newton served as a sea captain of a ship in the Atlantic slave trade, a violent storm off the coast of Ireland struck his vessel so severely that he called out to God for mercy. This moment marked Newton's turn toward God, what he called "the hour I first believed." Eventually leaving sailing behind, Newton then began studying Christian theology and was ordained in the Church of England in 1764. He served as a minister in Olney, England, where he began writing hymns.

"Amazing Grace" was published in *Olney Hymns* in 1779, but was rarely sung in England. It was in the United States where the song would become widely known during the early 1800s. Today "Amazing Grace" remains one of the most recognizable songs in the English-speaking world.

**April 1st** 


Children and Youth Bell Practice for Easter - we will practice this morning at 10 a.m.— come ring with us in celebration of Jesus resurrection on Easter morning.
