The howling winds that have wrapped themselves around our homes, uprooted trees, and scattered all types of outside décor have taken their toll these past few weeks. At night, it has been whistling through the branches of the trees along the property line of the parsonage leaving behind a tell-tell trail of limbs here there and everywhere. No sooner are they picked up, the wind blows in again, and it looks like the yard hadn't just been cleared of the debris the day before. Unfortunately, these winds don't stop

there; a domino effect steps into play as uprooted trees means downed wires which then results in power and cable outages. If you don't have a generator, then this finds you sitting in the dark, or candlelight, with flashlight at the ready, bundled up in sweaters and blankets and maybe even a sleeping bag. As of late, the winds have been so strong that they literally roared and the proverbial saying "In like a lion, out like a lamb" reminds us of the true nature of the spring weather that we can expect here in Somerset County.

The winds of spring also usher in Holy Week beginning with Palm Sunday, a day when another "lion" was expected as Jesus entered Jerusalem with crowds cheering and waving palms. Jesus was "the one" the prophets foretold of; "the one" who would be the Messiah that they, and generations before them, hoped for; "the one" who would shake things up and save them from their oppressors. A new "Lion King". That's what the crowds expected.

Jesus, however, was a different sort of "lion" for his mission on earth was to destroy the darkness of sin. Yes, others felt threatened by his "roar"; however, not because he was a warrior armed and ready to conquer but because he threatened their way of life. They had status, they had power, they had control. They knew comfort and security and they weren't about to give any of that up...for what? To love their neighbor? To turn the other cheek? Forgive someone who offended you? Are you kidding? To eat with "those people", make them feel welcome when everyone knows they are unclean.

<u>They</u> knew the law, intimately – they knew "the right way" of doing things – eating and dressing and working...even resting – "the how, the when, the where and the why"...and let's not forget the "who". Jesus was infringing on <u>their</u> territory...and just look what he did to the moneychangers, turning over tables in the temple...good hard earned money...money that could be lining their pockets...scattered to the four winds.

Jesus had shaken things up alright but in a good way. A way in which people were reminded that they were all sinners but were also loved...a way in which people could see with their eyes, hear with their ears, his teachings of forgiveness and compassion — those things that truly heal...the way of the gospel. Jesus would be the lion that went out like a lamb...on the cross. A colleague notes, "Because Christ died in weakness for sinners and won the victory for us, we can afford to be weak." We can admit that we are sinners — out loud. We can forgive others their trespasses because we know and trust that God has and is always ready to forgive us ours.

As Easter approaches, let us pause to remember and give thanks for this life-saving gift and share it with others...all to the glory of God.
