"I am the vine; you are the branches.

If you remain in me and I in you, you will bear much fruit..." John 15:5

As summer begins to loosen its grip and fall whispers its arrival—not through turning leaves just yet, but in subtler signs: yellow school buses rumbling down the street, street-lights flickering on a bit earlier, night sounds shifting to their cooler cadence. County fairs and firemen's carnivals dotting the calendar, farmstands brimming with late-summer squash and field-fresh tomatoes ready for canning (or between two slices of bread slathered with mayo!), and the fields themselves begin offering up their gifts. In these gentle signs, something stirs the senses—and I find myself remembering the garden my father planted behind our house on Avenue B in Latrobe...a stretch of soil filled with the treasures of the season: onions, peppers, tomatoes, and



squash. Dad hadn't grown up on a farm, but he loved digging into the earth. After long hours working in the melt shop at Teledyne Vasco—his clothes dusted in black from the hot furnaces and the smell of hot metal—he'd return to the garden. It was his pause, his place of wonder. A quiet connection to the rhythms of life and something sacred in the cycle of planting and harvesting.

Dad welcomed us into that rhythm. He'd fertilize the garden with fish we caught at Keystone Lake—always of legal size, of course—one day's catch nourishing the next day's growth. My siblings and I marched like tiny ants with watering cans in hand—trekking back and forth across the yard to the hose tucked on the far side of the house, making sure every plant had a drink.

And then, when the fruit came, we bore witness to the harvest: the heavy tomato vines drooping with ripeness, squash tucked beneath broad leaves, peppers turning from green to fire engine red. There was something holy in those quiet summer evenings—hands deep in the dirt, the squealing at the sight of a wiggling worm, giggles as water splashed from the watering cans baptizing our toes, and eyes wide as we lifted our T-shirts to gather whatever was ready.

After I was married, I started my own garden, and Dad became my living encyclopedia—full of advice, delight, and the occasional cautionary tale ("Don't plant that there. Trust me!"). I've followed in his footsteps with muddy knees and a curious heart, experimenting with new seeds, trying my hand at plants I'd never grown before. Gardening makes you brave in quiet ways. It teaches hope. Patience. The belief that growth can happen in places you've never tried before.

Jesus often used the language of gardens to speak of God's kingdom: seeds falling on good soil, weeds pulled from among wheat, branches bearing fruit. These weren't just metaphors—they were invitations. To participate in renewal. To trust the unseen work of God. To believe that something small—do I dare say as small as a mustard seed? - something ordinary—can be multiplied into abundance.

In just a few weeks, Faith Lutheran begins its fall faith formation: a season of growth, gathering, and spiritual tending. As we study, reflect, and explore together, we'll be planting seeds of grace and nurturing the soil of our shared life. This is where faith grows—sometimes with bold blooms, sometimes with slow unfolding leaves. Sometimes through laughter. Sometimes through listening.

So as we step into this season, may we carry gratitude for the gardens of our past and courage for the seeds we've yet to plant. May we dig deep in trust, share generously in love, and believe that God is growing something good in each of us.

And may we do it all—

Learning. Living. Laughing. Listening.
All in God's love.


