LET US LOVE TO TELL THE STORY...

As the days grow shorter and the lights begin to twinkle, I've been thinking about the stories we tell this time of year. Some are handed down through generations. Some are sparked by a single question in catechism class.

Back in October, we talked about Martin Luther—not just



the 95 Theses, but the lore that credits him with adding candles to Christmas trees. Of course someone asked, "Did they catch on fire?" (A fair question.) That led to stories of big-bulb lights from my own childhood—those glass globes that got so hot we used tin star-shaped reflectors to keep the heat in check and bounce the light outward. They were beautiful, and a little dangerous.

From there, we remembered the string lights that came next, then the pre-lit trees of to-day. My grandparents had one of those silver trees—do you remember them? All shimmer and shine, lit by a rotating color wheel that cast red, blue, green, and gold across the branches. And my Aunt Pearl had a tree that used optical lights—fibers that changed color and pulsed gently, like the tree itself was breathing light. That, too, was part of the story.

We've lit trees in many ways over the years. Blue lights for Advent, waiting in hope. White lights for Christmas, shining with joy. Each bulb, each flicker, each glow has helped us tell the story—of longing, of arrival, of light in the darkness.

In church, we've told the Christmas story with cardboard camels and animal costumes. With little kings carrying gifts and angels with wings. With candlelight and carols, with pageants and poetry, with music that filled the sanctuary and quiet moments that filled our hearts: One year, we colored the Christmas story with a giant crayon box—and the children were the crayons. Another year, camels told the story. Another, the wood of the trees—the one that built the manger and the one that formed the cross. And one year, the story was stirred up in the making of Christmas cookies, where flour and sugar came together to remind us of God's sweet gift. Even if we don't remember every line or every costume, we remember the feeling: the joy of gathering, the warmth of welcome, the flicker of hope in the dark. We remember the stories that made us laugh, the ones that made us cry, the ones that helped us believe.

These stories matter. They shape us. They remind us who we are and where we've been. And they help us tell the deeper story—the one that never changes. The story of a baby born in Bethlehem. Of light that came into the world and didn't burn out. Of God with us, then and now.

This December, keep telling the stories. The funny ones, the tender ones, the ones that make you pause. Tell them around the tree, at the table, in the car, in the sanctuary. Because every story of love and light and belonging points us back to the manger—and the story that embraces us all.

May God continue to bless you and your families—with warmth that gathers, peace that steadies, and joy that overflows. May the stories you share this season remind you of the love that holds us together, and the light that never goes out.

I invite you to join us for our Christmas candlelight services, where we'll carry on traditions held and welcome new ones. Come sing, come listen, come gather—come help me tell the story...again...


Worship
