From Hopscotch to Hope: Simplicity, Living with Grace

As we step into a new year, many of us carry memories of a childhood that unfolded before the world became digital, fast, and loud:

We remember Saturday mornings filled with cereal and cartoons like Scooby Doo, Johnny Quest, Mighty Mouse and The Flintstones, punctuated by quick lessons in math, history, science, and grammar from Schoolhouse Rock.

We recall backyards that became ball fields, driveways that turned into Hot Wheels race-tracks, porches that provided the backdrop for playing house, hosting doll-filled tea parties, or game after game of jax. We shared snacks and swapped Barbie clothes, and sidewalks became hopscotch boards as we skipped over cracks so we wouldn't "break our mothers' backs." and puddles became places to explore—little worlds of wonder waiting just beneath our feet.



We played games that required nothing more than a few friends, a patch of grass or pavement, and imagination. The streetlights were our “clocks”, not texts on cell phones or calls on “smart” watches.

Those days were not perfect, but they were simple. They taught us how to be present with one another, how to build friendships from shared snacks instead of shared Wi-Fi, and how to treasure the ordinary rhythms of family life. We didn’t realize it then, but those moments were shaping us—teaching us gratitude, patience, friendship and belonging.

Now, as the pace of life looks more like the speeds found on the Pennsylvania turnpike—fast, relentless, and exhausting—and screens of all sizes fill our days, we find ourselves remembering both worlds: the one before everything sped up, and the one we journey through now. That memory is not nostalgia alone—it is a gift. It reminds us that God’s presence is not bound to technology or trends, but is found in the ordinary, in the quiet, in the simple acts of love and faithfulness.

The psalmist declares: “*Teach us to number our days, that we may gain a heart of wisdom*” (Psalm 90:12). Wisdom comes not from clinging to the past or fearing the future, but from recognizing God’s hand in every season. And Ecclesiastes reminds us: “*For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven... a time to weep, and a time to laugh; a time to mourn, and a time to dance*”. These words, often read at funerals, are not only about endings—they are about the fullness of life, about God’s presence in every rhythm of our days.

The games we played, the meals shared, the laughter echoing in driveways—all of these were glimpses of grace. And the same grace meets us now, even in a world that feels complicated and hurried, where distractions and divisions often pull us apart—but God’s love still gathers us together.

As we begin this new year, may we carry forward the lessons of simplicity; cherish the moments that do not auto-save to a cloud but live in our hearts; and raise children and grandchildren with a love for presence over distraction. May we trust that the God who was faithful in our childhood is faithful still, guiding us into a future filled with hope.

May this year bring you wisdom to see God’s hand in ordinary days, courage to embrace each season with gratitude, and joy in the simple moments that remind us we belong to one another and to Christ.
